Club Personnel:

Club Instructors are Licenced, Insured, and hold current DBS documentation.

Students are licenced and insured through the *British Ishinryu Karate* association and by our governing body, *The English Karate Federation* (EKF).

Students without a current licence are not permitted to train.

Spectators will be small in number, and mostly the parents of our younger students.

Spectators will follow the guidance of our club instructors – for example, in regard to keeping clear of the training areas and following guidelines on photography.

Visitors: Occasionally, students from other Ishinryu clubs may join us in our Dojo. In all cases they will be required to hold a current licence.

Prospective students, alongside their parents or guardians, are invited to observe a lesson before deciding to join our club.

Individuals not connected with our association (excluding those considering joining us) will be excluded from all training sessions. Random spectators will not be allowed to watch our training sessions, or record images or videos, under any circumstances.

Injury from slips and trips	Students and Instructors	Medium	The training area is checked for hazards immediately before each training session. In addition, every instructor conducts a visual inspection whenever they take control of a class or part of a class. All personal belongings are kept clear of the training area. For example, kitbags, protective equipment, over-Jackets, and anything else that might constitute a trip hazard.
Minor injuries during training	Students and Instructors	Medium	Training areas are checked before each session to ensure surfaces are clear of obstacles. Students will wear suitable sports training shoes at all times if training outside. Inside training is conducted in bare feet. Instructors are first aid trained and able to deal with minor injuries. Portable first aid kits are available adjacent to the training area(s).
Adverse reaction to over exertion such as fainting, seizure and breathlessness.	Students	Medium	Our very experienced instructors will provide clear instruction to students. Students are aware of the need to follow Instructor guidance at all times. After a first verbal warning for any infraction, they will be removed from the training area. All sessions to start with a whole body warm up and finish with cool down activities. All Students are licenced by the <i>British Ishinryu Karate</i> Association and must show their current licence to gain entry to the training area. All licence holders are required to declare existing medical conditions on their application each year. Students are required to declare any relevant medical conditions that may arise during the licence year.

Muscular skeletal injury, concussion	Students and Instructors	Low	Close supervision and observation from instructors throughout the session will minimise any risk of injury. All sessions to start with a whole body warm up and finish with cool down activities. All Ishinryu students hold a license. A condition of this licence is to declare any medical conditions and to confirm medical fitness to train. Existing medical conditions are recorded as part of the licence record.
Blood borne viruses	Students and Instructors	Medium	All instructors are first aid trained. Portable first aid kits are kept adjacent to the training area. Soiled cleaning cloths and first aid materials to be suitably disposed of. No student will continue training if there is any continued risk of blood loss.
Negative Impact on Mental Health and wellbeing	Students	Low	All Ishinryu students will be fully licenced. A condition of this licence is full disclosure of existing medical conditions and any new conditions that may arise through the course of the annual licence. Club Instructors must be made aware of existing mental health issues and/or learning difficulties. Training will be adapted accordingly. Instructors will ensure that training sessions are structured to be inclusive and accommodate a range of needs and abilities.

Car Parking	Students Spectators	Medium	Those arriving by car are required to park safely in the designated areas outside the training hall.
